Sports Premium

The Primary School Sport Funding is additional Government support for use to improve Physical Education and Sports provision.

The use of this will be assessed as part of the Ofsted judgement of the quality of the school's leadership and management.

The total fund generated via Primary School Sport Funding is £8908. The allocated funding has been used to:

- Purchase the Newcastle PE and School Gold Sport Service to support the school with its Physical Education School Action Plan and develop staff confidence through CPD.
- Fund involvement in Schools Games Competitions inclusive of football, dance festival, cross country and school fun run.
- Fund the acquisition of resources.
- Contribute to the extension of swimming provision for KS2 above the minimum national curriculum expectation of 25m.
- Extended curriculum provision.

Additional funding was provided by the school.
