SPENDING

This year we were allocated £122,760.

Pupil Premium was used to financially support:

HLTAs, EAL and SEN support provide specialist subject knowledge to groups of children.

Proportion of salary of Teaching Assistants to support learning across the school

Funding for targeted interventions and enrichment clubs

Daily fresh milk for Pupil Premium Students

Residential trips for Years 4, 5 and 6

Programme licenses for Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Spellodrome and Lexia

Free before school supervised use of ICT suite for those children with no internet at home

Whole school counselling training programme with numerous staff now trained to offer counselling to vulnerable children within school.

Family Support Worker who worked closely with those families who needed support with housing, school, financial and parenting issues.

EWO and Safeguarding

Uniform provision giving the children a sense of pride in their appearance. Each PP child received a free jumper, polo shirt and book bag.

External companies used for curriculum enrichment e.g. Tiny Tweeties, M&M Productions, More than Dance and various visiting authors

Breakfast Club offered free of charge to PP children

This year our children outperformed children nationally with 83% working at the required standard for Phonics against the national 81%. This year our Pupil Premium children did not perform quite as well as those who are not Pupil Premium but were close.

The proportion of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium at Our Lady and St Anne's RC Primary is above average.

HOW DO WE USE PUPIL PREMIUM?

As OFSTED commented about our school, 'Excellent enrichment activities add to the richness of their learning and enjoyment.'



PUPIL SUPPORT:

We currently employ one teaching assistant for every class. Every morning teaching assistants work with small groups in Read, Write Inc. and Fresh Start to improve phonics and writing. HLTAs also deliver small group maths lessons for children who need more focused support, whether Gifted and Talented or SEN. The teaching assistants also provided additional intervention work before and after school and deliver lunchtime intervention in reading, phonics and writing. Our EAL specialist continues to promote academic achievement for our growing number of students for whom English is an additional language.

ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES:

Last year we offered our children a range of enrichment opportunities using the skills and expertise of our support staff as well as outside agencies. Extra-curricular activities included: Tennis, Netball, PE Agility, Football, Running, Cookery, Gardening, Newspaper, Forest schools, Handwriting, Homework, Toe by Toe, Singing, Chess, Book Club, Sewing and Storytelling. In addition to this our Pupil Premium grant was used to supplement residential trips to The Diocesan Youth Village, London and Dukeshouse Wood as well as individual class trips.

THE CURRICULUM:

We used Pupil Premium money to enhance our curriculum too. We pay for external agencies to come in and support our curriculum e.g. Tiny Tweeties, More Than dance and M&M Productions. We use Pupil Premium funds to extend our gifted pupils by offering bursaries so they are able to attend High School booster schemes where available. Software has been renewed to support curriculum development e.g. Mathletics, Lexia, Reading Eggs and Spellodrome.
