## SPENDING

### Pupil Premium was used to financially support:

- HLTAs provide specialist subject knowledge
- Funding for new lunchtime enrichment clubs e.g. beauty, colouring and sewing club
- Daily fresh milk for Pupil Premium Students
- \* Residential trips for Years 4, 5 and 6
- Programme licenses for Mathletics, Reading Eggs,
  Spellodrome and Lexia
- Training for teachers and teaching assistants to deliver intervention
- External providers for performance arts like Tiny Tweeties, M&M Productions and More than Dance
- \* Additional EAL and SEN support in class
- After school clubs like tennis, dance, gymnastics and football coaching
- Promotion of reading by funding visiting authors, reading competitions and World Book Day prizes.

### **PUPIL SUPPORT:**

We currently employ one teaching assistant for every class. Every morning teaching assistants work with small groups in Read, Write, Inc and Fresh Start to improve phonics and writing. HLTAs also deliver small group maths lessons for children who need more focused support, whether Gifted and Talented or SEN. The teaching assistants also provided additional intervention work before and after school using Numbers Count 1 and 2, and deliver lunchtime intervention in reading, phonics and writing. Our EAL specialist continues to promote academic achievement for our growing number of students for whom English is an additional language (59%).

### **FNRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES:**

THE CURRICULUM:

Last year we supplemented two residential trips for Years 5 & 6. We also used the money to pay for visiting theatre companies like: 'M&M Productions' and companies like 'Play in a Day' for children to produce their own dramas like Romeo and Juliet. The minibus enables us to travel to wider destinations cost effectively and this summer we took the whole school to the beach.

We used Pupil Premium money to enhance our curriculum too. We pay for

a peripatetic music teacher to teach instruments. Staff attended training to prepare for the new curriculum. Software and hardware were also

purchased to support those without access to resources at home.
