#### Communication and Language

# Listen with interest to the noises adults make when they read stories.

- Shows understanding of prepositions.
- Begin to use talk to express feelings/ emotions and ideas. Use simple sentences.
- Can retell simple past events, explain what is happening and will happen next.

## Personal, Social and emotional

- Interested in activities and starting to join in with others play.
- Demonstrates friendly behaviour, initiating conversations and starting to form good relationships with peers and familiar adults.
- Can play in a group, sharing and taking turns and know that some actions and words can hurt others feelings.

#### Physical Development

- Gain more independence in school routines such as going to the toilet, eating lunch independently.
- Explore different ways of moving with pleasure and confidence.
- Develop an awareness of self and the environment around to move freely and safely.
- Handle tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with

#### <u>Mathematics</u>

- Count up to 10 everyday objects e.g. pegs, ducks, shoes.
- Beginning to represent numbers using fingers, marks on paper and pictures.
- Shows an interest in numerals in the environment e.g. door numbers, on TV, telephones, bus numbers.
- Realises not only objects, but anything can be counted, including steps, claps and jumps.
- Shows an interest in shape and space by playing with shapes or making arrangements with objects in the environment.

### <u>Literacy</u>

- Has some favourite stories, rhymes or songs.
- Listen to stories, songs, poems, music and rhyme with increasing attention and recall.
- Join in with repeated refrains and anticipate key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- Recognise familiar words and signs such as own name and advertising logos.
- Distinguishes between the marks they draw and paint.

#### Understanding the world

- Shows interest in the lives of people who are familiar to them.
- Recognise and describe special times or events for family or friends.
- Can talk about things they have observed such as, plants, animals, weather and objects.
- Show care and concern for living things.
