

<p><b>Link Governor Visit</b> Chris Baker, PE Link Governor</p>	<p>PE Link visit 25 June 2018</p>
<p><b>Focus of visit</b> To find out about the impact of PE funding.</p>	<p><b>Classes/staff visited</b> I visited Miss Hodgson ( PE co-ordinator) to discuss the document 'Evidencing the Impact of the Primary PE and Sport Premium'.</p>
<p><b>Summary of activities eg talking to staff and pupils, looking at resources, had lunch etc.</b> I met Miss Hodgson and we looked at the document and discussed different aspects of it.</p>	
<p><b>What have I learned as a result of my visit?</b></p> <p>I learned that the key achievements were: a reduction in the use of external providers by upskilling staff in specific areas; encouragement of a healthy and active lifestyle through after-school provision; swimming for 120 children per week including all KS1 and reception. CPD had been undertaken and had been effective, particularly in Gymnastics. Playtime activities had improved. Further areas to improve were listed and included: progression of skills throughout the school; consistency in teaching approach to maintain momentum; delivering a broader curriculum. We discussed the statistics about swimming and water safety and I asked how they might be improved.</p>	<p><b>Positive comments about the visit</b></p> <p>It was very useful to go through the document and ask about particular areas. It gave me a better understanding of the PE curriculum and its development. The school takes part in several competitions and festivals which is good. TA support in PE has improved through CPD.</p>
<p><b>Aspects I would like clarified/questions that I have</b> I asked about the SLA which focusses on CPD for staff both teachers and TAs. The CPD has covered a variety of games linked to staff expertise and preference.</p>	
<p><b>Ideas for future visits</b> To look at progress in assessment in PE. It would be useful to see a curriculum map for PE .</p>
